- Demonstrates knowledge in dementia care, delirium, mental health issues and the impact that it has on the resident's quality of life, family members and care partners.
- Responsible for promoting and contributing to the development of a person-centred philosophy of care for residents exhibiting behavioural challenges and utilizes effective communication and interpersonal skills to collaborate with the resident, family, staff and care providers to ensure that a holistic plan of care is in place for the resident.
- Delivers person -centered care which recognizes both the uniqueness of each resident and an awareness of one's own contribution to the relationship, including personal attributes, values, and action Uses an assessment tools based on best practices to conduct initial and ongoing assessments describing interventions with respect to the behaviours of the residents Works flexible hours to meet behavioural needs of the resident exhibiting responsive behaviours.
